Because indoor public gatherings remain restricted under the Governor's Executive Orders, regular Board Meetings will be closed to in-person attendance by the public and conducted virtually through Zoom web conference and teleconference for the time being. The Agenda, with instructions for how residents may participate, is posted at the green monuments by the entrance and on the website gates CECSD www.cameronestates.net 72 hours prior to the meeting (the meeting documents will be also be available via the website). The Governor's plan is to lift EO N-29-20 on September 30, 2021. Any local agency meetings taking place after that time must ensure physical public access to all meeting locations.

Temporary Gate Code for Events

If you are having a large event, or work done on your property, the District office can issue you a temporary gate entrance code to give to your gardener, contractor or guests. Call the District Office at 530-677-5889 to arrange for a temporary code. Please request this code at least 7 days before needed. This code will be disabled when no longer needed by the resident.

Notices From the Board of Directors

1. At the May 20, 2021 Board Meeting the Board approved tree trimming for several roads in the District. The Board felt it was important to have dangerous tree branches, limbs and brush trimmed back now on these roads for the safety of our residents and visitors. The tree trimming was completed near the end of July 2021. Next year more roads will be examined to determine which tree branches and brush need to be cut back from the roads and road easements.

2. Get ready for another resident gate code change! I will be sending out the new resident gate code in a few weeks via District wide emails and signs at the gates to alert everyone to watch their emails from the District Office for the new code.

3. The Strolling Hills gates (the gates behind Safeway) are being kept open until necessary parts come in to fix them. Thank you for being patient! As COVID has affected everything in our lives for the last year and a half, it has also

had a deleterious effect on the supply chain. We will do our best to get them working again as soon as possible! Thank you for understanding!

El Dorado County Leash Law

This notice will keep repeating as many new families are moving into the District! The District Office has been receiving many complaints from residents about loose dogs and dogs off leash harassing their livestock and chasing them while walking, biking and riding horses in the District. We would like to remind all residents that according to El Dorado County Ordinance Code Title 6, Chapter 6.12 Section 6.12.070 -Running at large prohibited: (in part, look it up if you wish to see the full version): "No person owning or having control of any animal...shall permit such animal...to stray or run at large upon any...unenclosed private lot or other unenclosed private place in the County..." part A states: "Any animal other than working animals shall be confined by the owner or his or her agent on a leash of not more than ten feet in length during any time the animal is removed from an enclosed private lot or enclosed private place." FYI if your loose dog causes bodily harm to human or animal, or even "engages in behavior that requires a person to take defensive action to prevent physical injury...or otherwise causes injury to any domestic animal" you are guilty of a misdemeanor and could be fined and sued. Upon conviction your dog could be deemed dangerous and/or vicious and if any other violation occurs after that designation, fees will be imposed upon you; you will be held liable for damages and your dog impounded and/or euthanized. Please keep your dogs confined at home and on leash while walking them.
