Board meetings will be open to the public and held at Light Of The Hills Lutheran Church, 3100 Rodeo Road, Cameron Park, 7:00 p.m., on the 3rd Thursday of every other month, in the Multi-Purpose room. The latest update from the California Department of Public Health is they strongly recommend all persons, regardless of vaccine status, continue indoor masking. Thus, we are asking anyone who will attend the meeting to wear a mask, and that you sit 6 feet apart. Meeting documents will be available on the website as well.

Temporary Gate Code for Events

If you are having a large event, or work done on your property, the District office can issue you a temporary gate entrance code to give to your gardener, contractor or guests. Call the District Office at 530-677-5889 to arrange for a temporary code. **Please request this code at least 7 days before needed.** This code will be disabled when no longer needed by the resident.

Notices From the Board of Directors

1. Please consider running for the office of Board of Director for our District! There will be 3 full term seats on the Board of Directors up for re-election on the CECSD Board of Directors in the November 8, 2022 election. Road construction experience is not needed but would be helpful. The CECSD consists of a 5member board whose primary authority is the construction and maintenance of the CECSD roadways and easements. Board meetings occur every other month. Board members are paid \$80 per regular meeting. It does not cost anything to run for the position and you will be given good training if elected. If you are a registered voter living in the District you can pick up a Declaration of Candidacy form available at the El Dorado County Elections Department beginning July 18, 2022. The forms must be filed at the Elections Department in person by August 12, 2022, no later than 5:00 p.m. You can find more information in the Notice attached to this email.

2. There will be a Special Board Meeting on June 2, 2022 for the CECSD Board to interview the applicants and choose one for the position of General Manager. The Special Meeting will

be held at Light of the Hills Lutheran Church at 7:00 p.m. It will be a closed session for the interviews. The Board will reopen the meeting to the public to announce their decision for who will be hired for the position.

3. CECSD 2022 Road Work Project: At the May 19thst Board Meeting, 2 sealed construction bid packages for the 2022 Road Work Project were opened by the Board. Bidders were: Doug Veerkamp General Engineering Inc., and Macauley Construction Inc. Macauley Construction Inc., won the bid. Potholes and ditches will be repaired throughout the District on primary, secondary and tertiary roads. Shoulder backing and regrading will be done on Cameron Road and parts of Flying C Road. Longhorn Ridge, Sleepy Hollow and Spring Meadow Roads will be regraded and chip sealed. The work will begin in late June, and the General Manager will send out a District wide email with more information as soon as it is available.

El Dorado County Leash Law

This notice will keep repeating as many new families are moving into the District! The District Office has been receiving many complaints from residents about loose dogs and dogs off leash harassing their livestock and chasing them while walking, biking and riding horses in the District. We would like to remind all residents that according to El Dorado County Ordinance Code Title 6, Chapter 6.12 Section 6.12.070 - Running at large prohibited: (in part, look it up if you wish to see the full version): "No person owning or having control of any animal...shall permit such animal...to stray or run at large upon any...unenclosed private lot or other unenclosed private place in the County..." part A states: "Any animal other than working animals shall be confined by the owner or his or her agent on a leash of not more than ten feet in length during any time the animal is removed from an enclosed private lot or enclosed private place." FYI if your loose dog causes bodily harm to human or animal, or even "engages in behavior that requires a person to take defensive action to prevent physical injury...or otherwise causes injury to any domestic animal" you are guilty of a misdemeanor and could be fined and sued. Upon conviction your dog could be deemed dangerous and/or vicious and if any other violation occurs after that designation, fees will be imposed upon you; you will be held liable for damages and your dog impounded and/or euthanized. Please keep your dogs confined at home and on leash while walking them.
