- **1.** At the March 17, 2022 Board meeting Board Members reviewed the road work survey sheets, the Road Committee report and the draft road work scope for the 2022 Road Work Project to be put out to bid the last week of March 2022.

CECSD General Manager Retiring

General Manager Position Opening: The CECSD is seeking qualified candidates for the position of General Manager. This is a part-time, 20 hour per week home based position. The District does not

maintain an office so this is a "work at home" job and the General Manager must maintain the District files, records, and equipment in their home office. The position is a non-PERS position with no medical, dental, vacation, travel or sick leave benefits. The General Manager is an at-will position. Salary is \$25 per hour/\$500 per week. Qualifications: Knowledge of Excel, Word, and PDF, ability to prepare budgets, good written and oral communication skills, ability to deal with the public and other governmental agencies, theory and principles of management and public administration. Job Requirements: The General Manager shall carry into effect the expressed policies of the Board of Directors, including planning the short, medium and long-term work program for the District, also facilitating constructive and harmonious Board relations. S/he shall translate the goals and objectives of the Board to the community. S/he shall prepare and manage the District budget, conducting studies, making oral and written presentations and reports for and to the Board. The General Manager may work in the field as required. El Dorado County Leash Law

This notice will keep repeating as many new families are moving into the District! The District Office has been receiving many complaints from residents about loose dogs and dogs off leash harassing their livestock and chasing them while walking, biking and riding horses in the District. We would like to remind all residents that according to El Dorado County Ordinance Code Title 6, Chapter 6.12 Section 6.12.070 - Running at large prohibited: (in part, look it up if you wish to see the full version): "No person owning or having control of any animal...shall permit such animal...to stray or run at large upon any...unenclosed private lot or other unenclosed private place in the County..." part A states: "Any animal other than working animals shall be confined by the owner or his or her agent on a leash of not more than ten feet in length during any time the animal is removed from an enclosed private lot or enclosed private place." FYI if your loose dog causes bodily harm to human or animal, or even "engages in behavior that requires a person to take defensive action to prevent physical injury...or otherwise causes injury to any domestic animal" you are guilty of a misdemeanor and could be fined and sued. Upon conviction your dog could be deemed dangerous and/or vicious and if any other violation occurs after that designation, fees will be imposed upon you; you will be held liable for damages and your dog impounded and/or euthanized. Please keep your dogs confined at home and on leash while walking them.
