Temporary Gate Code for Events

If you are having a large event, or work done on your property, the District office can issue you a temporary gate entrance code to give to your gardener, contractor or guests. Call the District Office at 530-677-5889 to arrange for a temporary code. **Please request this code at least 7 days before needed.** This code will be disabled when no longer needed by the resident.

Notices From the Board of Directors

- 1. At the January CECSD Board Meeting, (our first Zoom meeting!) Director Doris Miller was re-elected President and Director Angela Johnson was re-elected Vice President. Director Joshua Clark was appointed Road Committee Chairman, Director and VP Angela Johnson was appointed Road Committee member. Director and VP Angela Johnson and Director Cory Hamma were appointed to the Budget Committee. Be on the look out for information on a possible new text message service for residents to join!
- 2. Please remove all debris from around and inside your culverts under your driveways or in other areas on your property. If you live near a creek, please remove any debris that could be picked up and carried away by rising waters due to rain. If the culverts and creeks are clogged with leaves, branches and other debris they will not drain water away from the roads properly, which causes flooding and damage to the asphalt road surfaces, and your property!
- **3**. Please clear the weeds from your road easement if you put up "No Spray" signs. Weeds need to be removed from the edges of the roads as their roots grow into the asphalt and cause cracking

in the road surface. Additionally, certain important road repairs can't be completed if weeds are growing in the asphalt.

4. <u>Notice:</u> Any resident who was given the <u>Contractor/Service gate code #5000</u> to give to your gardeners, pool services, contractors, etc., this code <u>will be deactivated on Monday.</u> <u>February 15, 2021.</u> If you did not receive an email or phone call from the District Office giving you the new Contractor/Service code, please contact the District Office at 530-677-5889 or email <u>cecsd@att.net</u> (This does <u>Not</u> replace the new Resident Code).

El Dorado County Leash Law

The District Office has been receiving many complaints from residents about loose dogs and dogs off leash harassing their livestock and chasing them while walking, biking and riding horses in the District. We would like to remind all residents that according to El Dorado County Ordinance Code Title 6, Chapter 6.12 Section 6.12.070 - Running at large prohibited: (in part, look it up if you wish to see the full version): "No person owning or having control of any animal...shall permit such animal...to stray or run at large upon any...unenclosed private lot or other unenclosed private place in the County..." part A states: "Any animal other than working animals shall be confined by the owner or his or her agent on a leash of not more than ten feet in length during any time the animal is removed from an enclosed private lot or enclosed private place." FYI if your loose dog causes bodily harm to human or animal, or even "engages in behavior that requires a person to take defensive action to prevent physical injury...or otherwise causes injury to any domestic animal" you are guilty of a misdemeanor and could be fined and sued. Upon conviction your dog could be deemed dangerous and/or vicious and if any other violation occurs after that designation, fees will be imposed upon you; you will be held liable for damages and your dog impounded and/or euthanized. Please keep your dogs confined at home and on leash while walking them.
